Working with TCKs at CAG

Dear friends and family,

These last few months have possibly been some of the craziest months I have experienced here—however, they have also shown me time and again how great our God is!

Crazy Event 1:

While visiting some Mayan ruins with a friend over our Mid-Winter break, we came across a Brujo (witchdoctor) and several indigenous people performing a ritual ceremony. Though many people in this country profess to be Christian (primarily Catholic), their beliefs are strongly tied to those of their Mayan ancestors. This was a great reminder to me of how great the spiritual need and hunger in this country is—there are still so many here who have not yet heard the good news of Jesus Christ! Pray for the missionaries, not only connected to CAG, but the others through the country, as they work to share the Gospel with everyone!

Crazy Event 2:

My boss fell off his roof...yep, true story. Our fearless director, Rick Carey, was on top of the roof trying to get a bees nest out of his chimney, stepped on some molding, and fell twenty feet to the ground. Thankfully, he didn't have any major injuries, just a broken wrist and a few broken ribs. Please pray for him as he continues to recover.

Crazy Event 3:

One of my students, Leah, had emergency brain surgery. Last Friday, Leah got really sick at school. When her parents took her to the doctor, they discovered the shunt she had placed in her brain when she was younger wasn't draining. Friday night she had emergency surgery to replace the shunt. Her parents are hoping she gets to go home today, and her classmates are eagerly awaiting her return. We spent the morning making get well cards for Leah and praying for her.

Life Around Here:



I had a chance to go with some friends to Kairos, a ministry in Guatemala City. This place is like The Ronald McDonald House—only free! There is actually a Ronald McDonald House in Guatemala, but people can only stay there for two nights in a row AND it costs money. Before Kairos, many families with children in the hospital or with children getting chemo treatment had to spend the night on the streets. Kairos gives them a place to stay. We had a chance to fix a dinner, take it there, and serve the people staying there.



Six weeks this year have been spent on Professional Development for the Elementary Teachers (aka, learning how to be better teachers). Sharon Meiers has come three times this year, for two weeks at a time, to work with us on teaching writing (she also brings us a lot of goodies from the States). It's been great to learn so much from her!

Please do not forget that without financial support, I cannot continue to serve here! I know that I am exactly where God wants me to be—but I need your help and the help of people like you to stay! If I have to leave, I am leaving CAG without a 4th grade teacher and dozens of missionary families and Guatemalan families in the ministry without a teacher for their children! Hundreds of people that the parents of my students minister too will be affected by this too, as parents will then have to figure out a way to educate their children and balance their ministries! Please consider supporting me not only in prayer, but also financially!

- My 4th graders—Pray that I will be the teacher that they need!
- Rick Carey—Our director, please pray God continues to heal him from his fall! He just had the pins in his broken arm taken out.
- Leah—Please pray for her complete healing from the surgery! Also, pray for her parents! And praise—I just found out for sure that SHE IS HOME AND In SCHOOL !!!!!!!
- Health—. Please pray that I am healthy for the rest of the year. This class, especially, needs that routine and structure!
- One of our Korean students was recently kidnapped and thankfully, released soon afterwards. Please pray for emotional healing for this student and the family as they heal. Also pray for a smooth transition, as they are in Korea for the summer.
